We aim to improve access to high-quality sickle cell care for people with sickle cell disease living in Prince George's County.

The new infusion program at the University of Maryland Capital Region Health is projected to open in early 2023. Enhanced Transition services for adolescents and young adults are now available at Children's National, and community resources are currently available for patients with sickle cell living in Prince George's County.
